## Belinda Stronach raises money for breast cancer surgery

When family physician and medical journalist Dr. Marla Shapiro contacted Belinda Stronach to ask for her support in raising funds for breast cancer reconstructive surgery, she had no idea that Belinda was facing her own private battle with breast cancer.

That conversation and her own personal experience resulted in Belinda launching a campaign to raise \$2 million to create the Belinda Stronach Chair in Breast Cancer Reconstructive Surgery. She has raised over \$1 million to date. She hopes that her commitment to the Chair will raise awareness about breast cancer reconstruction and address a gap in the care of women who are diagnosed and treated for breast cancer.

"Losing your breasts is not only physically painful, it affects you emotionally – your psyche, your self esteem, your dignity. It is my hope that this Chair will enable surgeons to be trained in the techniques necessary for successful breast cancer reconstruction so that Canadian women can have more options when considering their treatment."

CTV's Dr. Shapiro, author of *Life in the Balance – My Journey with Breast Cancer*, has been working hard to raise both funds and awareness through the creation of a chair in breast cancer reconstructive surgery.

"This Chair will be the cornerstone for a comprehensive program for breast cancer survivors who seek breast reconstruction. I see the program consisting of patient education programs and clinical research to improve outcomes," she said.

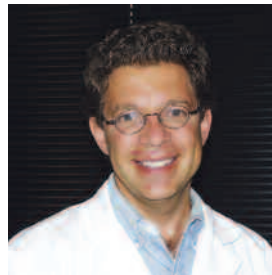
She also said breast reconstructive surgery is part of healing with dignity. She encourages women to ask their physicians about the different types of reconstructive surgery available to them. It is estimated that only 10 per cent of breast cancer survivors discuss reconstructive surgery with their healthcare team.

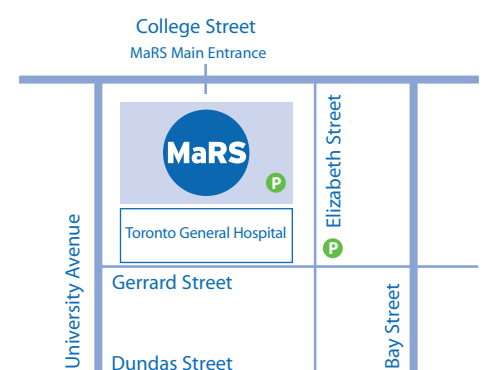

## You made 2007 a breakthrough year

Thanks to your support, our Hospitals and Research Institutes made huge strides in developing vital new medical treatments. Here are some accomplishments that your support helped achieve:

- Dr. Peter St. George-Hyslop, Director of Toronto Western Research Institute, and a team of international researchers identified a new gene associated with late onset Alzheimer's disease. This discovery may be one of the most important genetic markers for early detection and screening of this disease.
- An exciting new procedure took place at the Peter Munk Cardiac Centre when clinicians repaired a common heart defect with an implant that encourages the heart's own healthy tissue to grow and heal itself. Derwyn Miller became the first North American patient to receive the new implant.
- Surgeons at the Krembil Neuroscience Centre are leading the world in Deep Brain Stimulation – a revolutionary treatment for alleviating depression by implanting electrodes in a targeted area of the brain. It has tremendous potential for treating a host of neurological disorders including Parkinson's disease.
- Toronto General Hospital was the first Canadian hospital to acquire the Aquilion One, a CT Scanner that produces three-dimensional images of the human body and detects early warning signs of heart attack and stroke. This \$2.5 million technology represents the next big leap in medical imaging of the heart.

Breakthroughs like these, and the lives saved, are possible because of your tremendous support.

# Donors renew commitment to health of artists worldwide

Six years ago, the Al & Malka Green Artists' Health Centre opened at Toronto Western Hospital in tribute to the generosity of the Greens. Building on their longtime support of the artistic community, they have reaffirmed their vision with a recent gift of \$150,000.


"Supporting the unique health needs of this community is very important to Al and me," said Malka Green.

The donation will be split between two key areas. First is to support the research of the Centre's Research Director Dr. David Cassidy. The gift will support Dr. Cassidy's study on the perceptions of musculoskeletal injury and support among professional dancers around the globe.

"I am very grateful to the Greens for their support of this research study. It will attract international collaboration from Canada, Sweden and Israel and will allow us to see how varying social and medical support affects a dancer's attitudes toward pain and injury," says Dr. Cassidy.

The gift will also help provide subsidies for artists to access services at the Centre. The artists' subsidy

program has been a successful component of the Centre's services: approximately 60 artists received subsidy for treatment including dancers, musicians, actors and visual artists. The Greens' new donation will help increase that number to 150.

The Al and Malka Green Artists' Health Centre was created to serve professional artists in need of health care services, whether it is a referral to a family doctor, ongoing physiotherapy, short-term counseling or orthopedic surgery. The Centre treats over 2,500 artists each year.
